

Open call for creative roles

As part of our creative approach, we will recruit a proportion of freelance positions through open call outs to ensure accessible, fair and representative practices.

We are delighted to be able to offer a number of opportunities to local creatives across a slate of work for 2025 at both Mayflower Theatre and Studios. If you require flexibility because of access needs or caring responsibilities, please let us know and we will offer further support including advance notice of production schedules, where possible. Diversity and Inclusion are central to our work at Mayflower, we are a Disability Committed Employer, and our recruitment process is open to all.

Whilst this is an open call and we are happy to consider all submissions, we strongly encourage artists who are based in or have links to the South and the Solent to apply. We are defining this region as Portland to Portsmouth from east to west, and Basingstoke to the Isle of Wight, from north to south. We seek to support and build a sustainable and vibrant artistic community in Southampton and the region, believing that having outstanding creative teams with strong links to our area will develop an ecology that will help culture thrive. Our ambition is to achieve greater diversity so that our organisation better reflects the city and country in which we live.



About us

Mayflower is committed to providing exceptional theatre and arts experiences for everyone, both in Southampton and beyond. We work in our community and at our venues, **Mayflower Theatre** and **Mayflower Studios**.

Mayflower Theatre is a Grade II listed building and Mayflower Studios is a new multi space theatre, both venues are in the heart of Southampton with one Mayflower goal of providing inspiring experiences for all.

Mayflower offers a diverse and inclusive programme of shows and events and sees more than 520,000 people visit each year which resulted in contributing over £67 million to the local economy in 2023/2024. After operating costs, all surplus is invested in maintaining their venues and their artistic and participation programmes to make arts and culture accessible across the city and communities they serve. Mayflower has seen more than 200,000 engagements with local people over the last 12 years to support them in discovering and developing a love of the arts with a particular focus on underrepresented and disadvantaged groups within the community.

Mayflower were Associate Producers on Music & Lyrics production of *Fiddler on the Roof* directed by Craig Revel-Horwood and starring Paul Michael-Glaser, the Leicester Curve production of *Beautiful* with Theatre Royal Bath, *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang* with Crossroads Productions and *Titanic the Musical* tours in 2018 and 2023 directed by Thom Southerland.

They also produced the mid-scale tour of Sizwe Banzi is Dead with John Pfumojena. Their co-production of Fantastically Great Women Who Changed the World with Kenny Wax Family Entertainment had its world premiere at Mayflower Studios and went on to win the UK Theatre Award for Best Family Entertainment. They co-produced Frantic Assembly's Metamorphosis, and in 2024 co-produced The Lion Inside and Coming to England with Nicoll Entertainment, and The Mountaintop with Leicester Curve. They also produce their own Christmas Productions in Mayflower Studios which include Peter Pan; An Awfully Big Musical Adventure, Second Star to the Right, Alice; A Musical Adventure in Wonderland, A Christmas Carol, Down the Rabbit Hole, Counting Down to Christmas and The Wind in the Willows: Toad's Musical Adventure.

Noël and Gertie

Noël and Gertie is a charming and witty two-hander play with music, celebrating the legendary friendship and professional partnership of Noël Coward and Gertrude Lawrence. Compiled from Coward's diaries, letters, songs, and scenes from his plays, the piece offers an affectionate portrait of two theatrical icons. Blending sparkling dialogue, classic songs, and scenes from beloved works like *Private Lives*, *Noël and Gertie* is a nostalgic and elegant tribute to a golden age of theatre.



We are looking for a hands on CSM as this role will involve some reasonable SM duties.
